Still having trouble with that computer? We can help!

The library offers two cycles of computer classes: beginner and intermediate beginner.

Beginner classes are very basic, introductory level material. Intermediate classes go a little further in depth. Not sure which is right for you? Let us know your experience level and we can try to place you in the appropriate grouping.

The Introductory Cycle consists of the following 3 classes: Introduction to Computers I,

Introduction to Computers II and How to search the Library Catalog, and Introduction to the Internet.

These will be offered for 3 weeks on Tuesdays at 6:30 p.m. OR Fridays at 11:00 a.m. starting July 9 or 12, respectively.

The Intermediate cycle will consist of the following classes: Review of Computer Basics, Word processing using Microsoft

Word and Works, and Searching the Internet. These will be offered for 3 weeks on Tuesdays at 6:30 p.m. OR Fridays at 11:00 a.m. starting some time in August. Call for the schedule of classes.



Call the library to sign up or to be placed on a waiting list for the next class. Class sizes are limited due to space constraints.

Quilt Program

The Library will be having a lecture on quilts and quilting history on August 6th.

Our lecturer, Joann Belson, has been quilting for about 13 years. Her talk will focus particularly on Baltimore quilts, which are album quilts of the mid-19th century. She will include an

overview of the times and how they are reflected in the quilts. Not only are these quilts wonders of beautiful needlework, they also act as historical documents of the time. Many of the designs and colors on Baltimore album quilts have symbolic content that may be

interpreted as references to specific social, religious, or political beliefs and groups.

The program will begin at 7 p.m. The talk and question period will last about an hour.

A great first novel is hard to come by but author Alice Sebold succeeds with this interesting book, *The Lovely Bones*.

When we first meet 14 year old Susie Salmon, our narrator, she is already in heaven. She is the victim of a murder and tells us the story of her short life, her

family and friends, and the grieving and healing process they all go through to accept her death.

The author does an excellent job of using Susie as an omniscient narrator who is privy to more information than she ever would have known had she remained on

earth.

What I thought would be a sad story turned out to be a wonderful testament to the healing power of time and love.

With good reviews in *Publishers Weekly* and other review sources, expect this book to be a big hit this summer.

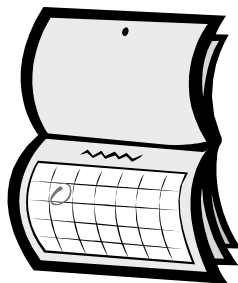
